- ★ The **Graham/Daimler Chrysler Corporation decision of December 2, 2004** - where the Supreme Court of California upheld a state court ruling limiting fees to those disabled plaintiffs who first attempt to resolve the action.
- ★ Learn how some plaintiffs' counsel are attempting to superficially comply with **Tipton/Daimler Chrysler** cases to obtain attorneys' fees and how to respond.
- ★ Learn to create a plan of access and steps to take to potentially avoid an ADA access lawsuit.
